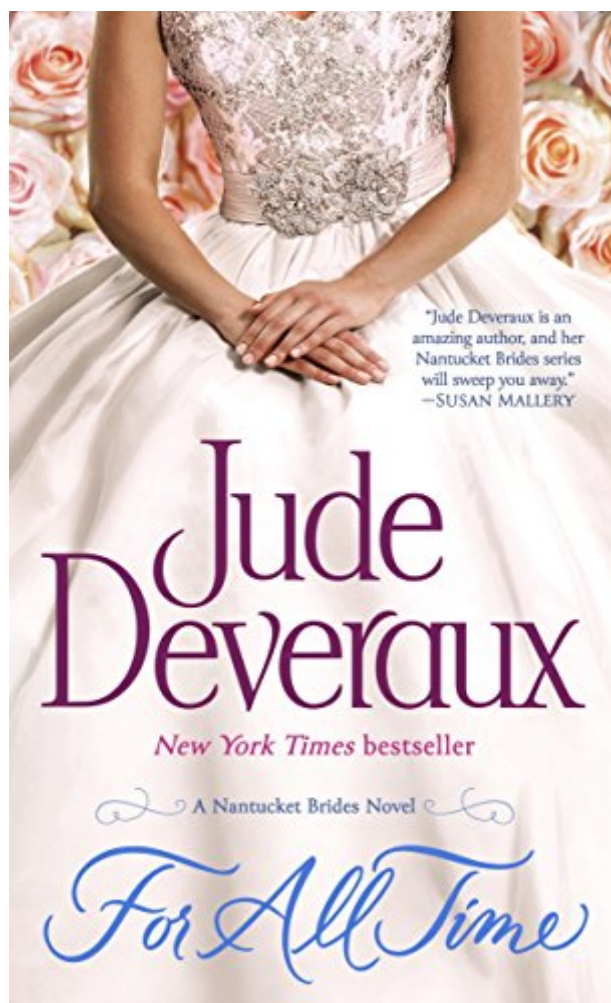

I'll be honest: I liked the Edilean series. I was disappointed when I heard Jude was abandoning it to return to the Montgomery-Taggerts. Having said that, it seems that Jude has entered a second Renaissance with this series, and this book is just everything a fan could ask for, and then some. Graydon Montgomery is the Crown Prince of Lanconia. He has come to Nantucket with his twin, Rory, for the wedding of Jared Montgomery Kingsley to Alix Madsen (Book 1 in the series, True Love.) He's immediately smitten with bridesmaid Toby Wyndam, who has simply never found a man worthy of tempting her into a love affair. However, Graydon is engaged-to-be-engaged to an appropriate lady in Lanconia. Graydon immediately tells Toby who he is, thankfully, so there's none of this "I have to tell you something..." later. They start out as friends. Graydon arranges to stay on Nantucket for a week while his twin pretends to be him back home. As Graydon and Toby get to know each other better, they are swept back into the past to fix a two-hundred-year-old love affair that ended in tragedy. For a veteran Jude fan, this book is like a wish list woven together as enthralling entertainment. The return of the Lanconians! Many inside-joke references to past Montgomery books! (Toby is "A Maiden," wink-wink, nudge-nudge!) Time travel! A cameo by J.T. and Aria!!!! (I know, they HAVE to be in their 90s, but...hey, royalty lives long lives, right? Look at Queen Elizabeth II and Prince Philip.) And even though you might think halfway through that the ending is going to be predictable...it's not. Even though it's difficult for me, someone who has read Jude Deveraux's books for about 25 years, I tried to seriously look at this from the point of view of the non-fan.

FOR ALL TIME is the second book in the Nantucket Brides Trilogy. It is also related to Deveraux's long running Montgomery-Taggart family series. This book begins at the wedding for the couple in the first book of the trilogy. This book is about Graydon Montgomery and Toby Wyndam. Toby is a bridesmaid and Graydon can't stop watching her. According to family legend Toby is perfect for Graydon because she can tell the difference between him and his identical twin. Graydon is the crown prince of Lanconia and already has his bride picked out for him. Graydon, however, is intrigued by Toby and when the opportunity presents itself, he convinces his twin brother to take his place while Graydon remains in Nantucket to spend time with Toby. The book examines issues of fate, destiny, time travel, obligation, duty and love. Graydon is definitely enamored of Toby but doesn't intend to do more than spend time with her because he knows that it is his duty to marry the woman chosen for him and he doesn't intend on having a sexual relationship with Toby. I really liked Graydon and Toby and it was clear from the beginning that these two were meant to be together. I don't know whether it is common for Deveraux to have time travel elements in her books, but of the couple of books I have read, that theme has appeared in most of the books. In this case, the time travel allows the characters to escape their fixed lives and see their problem in another form. It did seem to me that the time travel element was a way of allowing these characters to engage in sex without having to face the real complications in present time. I will state that I haven't read the first book in the trilogy so I have no idea what effect that book would have on my view of the book.
