Each visit requires a copay. Where as the other physician simply did an ultrasound during the same visit in house with same day results. He also mentioned that if he is taking testosterone, he pretty much will not be producing sperm. He is now taking chomid as an alternative. It takes a little longer but it provides him what he needs and increases his sperm count. I think I'm better off reading medical forums for free.

This guide was really helpful to me since I knew nothing about the IVF process. The first two chapters outline the entire process and are very educational. Risks are also made clear. I knew twins and triplets are very possible in this process but didn't know about some of the health and emotional problems for the baby as it becomes an adult. There is also a chapter on some of the bias against IVF by the church and others in society. Some people feel it's not natural and for many doctors it's all about the money. Whether you agree or disagree about the ethical questions, this guide will definitely educate you in the procedure and give you some clarity in the decision making process.
