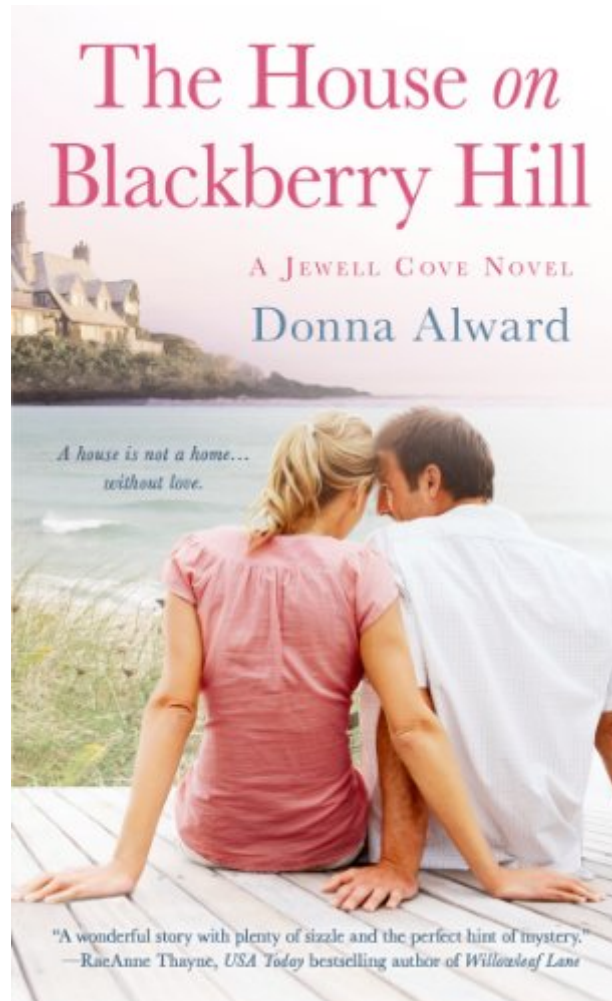

The writing is excellent and the setting and characters very welcoming. The heroine Abby has been given a new start in life. She is pretty much a loner with only had her grandmother to rely on. Now with her grandmother dead, she's on her own, but finds out she's an heiress and property owner to a huge house in Jewell Cove.
