

Itâ ™s his dream come true, but reality has a way of being much less wonderful than a dream. On his first day with the team, he discovers one of the publicists is his high-school sweetheart, Georgia Worthington, the girl he thought he would spend forever with, the one that broke his heart at graduation that heâ ™s never fully got over. Itâ ™s also the first day on the team for the new coach, and since heâ ™s Georgiaâ ™s father, heâ ™s holding quite a grudge against Leo too. Leoâ ™s arrival isnâ ™t exactly easy for Georgia either, no easier really than giving him up six years ago. Though sheâ ™s determined to keep the relationship between them entirely professional, a poorly timed revelation at a press conference makes her realize keeping it from being personal might be harder yet. Those who have read my reviews over the past months already know that lâ ™m a gay man and that Sarina Bowen is the only author, at least so far, whose M/F novels I also read. There is one reason for this: even though M/F sex scenes do nothing for me, I know that when I pick up one of her books, lâ ™m going to get a well-crafted, well-told story. And thatâ ™s true here too.
