


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# Clinically Oriented Anatomy

I really like this textbook, but don't get the kindle edition. I was not able to effectively search within the textbook. Page numbers were not written on the pages. Fortunately I received a free refund from and ordered a print copy.

If you want to understand the detailed structure of the human body and how it relates to life as a human, as well as one who cares for humans, this is your best choice for a reference source. And who am I to judge? Not exactly nobody. I've been a Primary Care physician in a medically underserved area for thirty four years and counting. Practiced Emergency Medicine and Urgent Care medicine and similar during that time. I've been using this reference source in the hardcopy and now digital form for at least a decade now, and it seldom fails me. And how is this important? Well here's common a For Instance: you need to drain a skin abscess or remove a skin lesion and want to review what structures are present in the area in which you'll be working (thus best to avoid damaging important structures and to minimize scarring). This source is the first place I check. Here's another: you're seeing a middle aged woman who just resumed jogging a month ago, who now presents with pain with movement just in front of her Achilles tendon. What structure could be involved? This source would be the first place I'd check. You're caring for a person who tells you that they've got a "hernia", meaning something going on with their digestion. What sort of hernia could do that? This source would be the first place I'd check. A person comes to clinic with a lump in their neck. Is it an enlarged lymph node or something else? This source would be the first place I'd check. Bottom Line: if you need real-world relevant information about human anatomy, well explained and illustrated, look no further than this reference source. Yes there is the condensed "clinical essentials" version of this book, but I don't see the point. This book is very thorough and is very easy to read. It's almost like a novel "this is the story of the lower limb". It also provides muscle tables with full and partial innervations to the smallest muscle you can think of. The illustrations are also very clear and helpful. The book itself is heavy and the soft covers get scuffed easily. shipped mine with half the front cover bent in half. I'm sure the digital version of the book is equally as good as the printed one.

The kindle version is formatted in such a way that the book is almost useless. No page numbers and very poor illustration quality.

Fantastic text book, I recommend it highly, I cannot say enough good things about it. I am currently taking clinical anatomy in med school and I have an A average, I credit it to this book (most certainly not my professors or their notes, lol, if your in med school you know exactly what I mean). Invest in this book it's worth every penny, I actually love it so much I own 2 hard copies (one for school, one for home...it's heavy) and a kindle version.

I used an earlier edition of this textbook as a medical student. I have found this edition to be excellent. I have it on my Kindle which puts this excellent book at my fingertips as a reference. The "blue" boxes are fabulous as they were when I was a medical student but the anatomical explanation are priceless too. Yes, this is a very dense book but it is very readable too. I encourage my students to set a daily reading schedule which this book's organization allows nicely. A continued excellent textbook in many respects.

I bought the Kindle version because I like the convenience of carrying around all of my textbooks...but this Kindle edition was anything but convenient. The book is difficult to navigate, with no way to see multiple pages and slow page turns (I'm using an iPad 4...you would think it would be smooth). The table of contents is a joke. The pictures are very poor quality. If you zoom in (like you NEED to on every picture) it looks like the pictures were scanned at a low resolution. I owned the book for about half an hour before I returned it for a refund. My professor agreed with me that it is a terrible version of this book. Do NOT buy this if you actually want to study from it!

This book is not inexpensive but it is wonderful guide to the field of human anatomy. If you are

interested in how truly miraculous and complex the human body is then this is the book for you. That said it is intended for medical students and is fairly dense so if you are looking for a more cursory examination of the subject there may be better resources. The book is heavy and it is too bad that there is no online version from the publisher as is the case with many other medical books. I am not sure if there is a kindle version but I would not recommend that only because I have read a number of critical reviews of books with numerous illustrations on the kindle.

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
